

Julie Kilmer Executive Director

Julie Kilmer, a graduate of the Oakcrest class of 2019, grew up in Rockville, Maryland with 10 brothers and sisters, right behind their parish the Shrine of St. Jude. She graduated from the University of Scranton this May, with a major in Criminal Justice. After four years of ROTC, she was also commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Army Reserves. Passionate about her faith, Julie was the founder of many faith based programs in college, such as women's group, Marian prayer group, and ROTC bible study. She was a member of the Alpha Sigma Nu Honor Society, co-founder of a babysitting organization and her favorite, served as the Students for Life club President at the University.

Being the fourth oldest of 11 children and having a father that was adopted, she was inspired at a young age to spread the message about the value of every human life. To promote a culture of life, she has actively worked as part of the prolife movement under the Nationwide prolife organization, Students for Life.

On June 24, 2022, she celebrated the reversal of Roe v. Wade outside the Supreme Court and this helped motivate Julie to spread the pro-life message to her community. That day she realized that fighting for the unborn and pregnant mothers was not only a fight she wanted to take part in, but her calling.
